Life Skills


Students should be practicing these skills prior to coming to kindergarten:



At what age can we start?

Eligible Age for Kindergarten

5 years old on or before September 1, 2023

Eligible Age for First Grade

6 years old on or before September 1, 2023



I'm ready! Sign me up!



- Registration begins online via the link on the Oso Grande website.
 - Click on the "School In Information " link and then click on "Registration Information"
- Print out documents and bring to school site beginning Thurs. February 16th thru Fri March 31st from 8:30-2:30 pm when school is in session.

Registration is as easy as 1, 2, 3



- 1. Bring ALL required documents to the office
 - Proof of Immunizations
 - Proof of residency (2) (current gas, water or electric statement <u>AND</u> current mortgage statement or rental agreement)
 - Child's age verification

Additional Information

- Please arrive to school on time. If arriving late, students <u>must</u> be checked in at the front office in order to update their attendance.
- A government issued picture i.d. is required to sign a student out early. If another person will be picking up your child, they must be listed under your child's emergency contact information as well as have their government issued picture i.d.
- Our campus is a closed campus during school hours.
- All visitors/volunteers must enter through the office, sign in/out with their <u>government issued photo i.d.</u> and wear a volunteer/visitor sticker while on campus.
- Please label your kiddo's belongings! Our Lost n' Found overfloweth!

Health at School

When to keep your child home

- Temperature of 100.4
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Undiagnosed rash
- Unusually red eyes with drainage (not allergy related)

Medication at School

- Requires doctor's order/parent consent form
- Should be dropped off by parent to front office
- Must be in original container with pharmacy label
- Kept in a locked cabinet in the health office



Report of Health Examination

Complete after February 15, 2023

CUSD recommends this be completed before entry into Kindergarten or 1st grade

Blank form is in kindergarten packet

Can be completed at same time as a well child visit


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Immunizations



- Students must be fully immunized before entering kindergarten
- You must show proof of immunization when registering your child
- Exceptions include a permanent medical exemption or a temporary medical exemption- Updates to requirements January 1, 2021

Kindergarten Immunization Requirements



Immunization Law for 2022-23 School Year

 Beginning January 1, 2021, doctors will use an electronic form available through the California Immunization Registry (CAIR). CAIR is a secure computer system that is already used across California that stores children's immunization (shot) records. The doctor can send the form to the child's parent or school, or the school can access the form through CAIR directly. Schools can only accept medical exemptions on the CAIR form. If you have questions or concerns about CAIR's system or forms, please contact your District Nurse.

Hearing and Vision



- Students will have their hearing and vision screened in kindergarten
- This a state mandated requirement
- Subsequent screenings are done in 2nd, 5th and 8th grade

Specialized Health Needs Action Plans

- Food Allergy Action Plan
- Insect Allergy Action Plan
- Asthma Action Plan
- Seizure Action Plan



What can I do to help prepare my child for kindergarten?

- Read to your child.
- Provide a quiet area/time for school work.
- Ask "why" when your child wants something.
- Use the word "because" after "no" or "not tonight".
- Encourage questions and explore answers.
- Explain and discuss issues or problems in your house (leaky faucet), neighborhood (dog barking all night), and community (cars cannot be parked on street after midnight).
- Compare how things are alike and different (books, movies, food, etc.).
- Limit technology.
